Year 9 Humanities - SAW Outline for students (May 2014)

- There will be a **booklet** with various **sources of information** about the different natural disasters proposed in the lessons: Earthquake, tsunami, hurricane, typhoon, volcanic eruption.
- Choose a natural disaster and the relevant sources of information that go with it.
- Write a **research question** that addresses the chosen natural disaster.
- Write a **response** (essay) to the research question that they have written.
- Students **reference the sources (bibliography)** they have used to answer the research question.
